Restrictions and Requirements:

The Colorado Clean Air Act does not allow fires that are a nuisance to others

1. Open Burning is prohibited by the Basalt and Rural Fire Protection District between the dates of **May 31st** and **October 1st**.
2. The owner or responsible person shall notify Aspen Communication Center prior to and after burn is completed at **920-5310**.
3. This permit shall be available at the burn site while burning, and it must be shown upon request of an appropriate official.
4. Open burning is only allowed during daylight hours. All fires must be extinguished before dusk.
5. Open burning is not allowed during periods of extreme fire danger or when winds exceed 5 miles per hour. Burning is discouraged during afternoon hours because of potential winds.
6. Construction materials, treated or painted woods, trash, any plastics, tires or similar dense or toxic smoke producing substances are prohibited from being burned.
7. Open burning is prohibited within 25 feet of any structure.
8. A responsible person must attend open burning at all times.
9. Adequate fire control equipment (shovels, water, fire pumps, etc.) must be kept on site and available while burning.
10. Should the open burn spread out of control or off of the burn property, and fire extinguishment becomes necessary, the owner agrees to pay for any resources other than those owned by the Fire District that may be needed to control and extinguish the fire.
11. The Fire District, Eagle County, and the employees thereof, in issuing a permit, assume no liability or responsibility for any hazardous situation created by the applicant or any damage that may occur as a result of open burning.
12. No open burning is allowed within the El Jebel Mobile Home Park.
13. The Fire District has the discretion to extinguish a burn at any time for any reason.

6. All burns are to be supervised. (IFC 307.4)
7. Permits can be revoked at the discretion of the Chief or his designated representative.(IFC 105.5)
8. The appropriate fire protection district and communications center must be notified before starting all burns

Restrictions and Requirements:

The Colorado Clean Air Act does not allow fires that are a nuisance to others

1. The owner or responsible person shall notify Vail Communications Center prior to and after burn is completed at **479-2201 and the appropriate fire district or department.**
2. This permit shall be available at the burn site while burning, and it must be shown upon request of an appropriate official.
3. Open burning is only allowed during daylight hours. All fires must be extinguished before dusk.
4. Open burning is not allowed during periods of extreme fire danger or when winds exceed 20 miles per hour. The suggested burning time is between 5:30am and 10:30am. Burning is discouraged during afternoon hours because of potential winds.
5. Construction materials, treated or painted woods, trash, any plastics, tires or similar dense or toxic smoke producing substances are prohibited from being burned.
6. Open burning is prohibited within 30 feet of any structure.
7. A responsible person must be on site and attending the open burning at all times.
8. Adequate fire control equipment (shovels, water, fire pumps, etc.) must be kept on site and available while burning.
9. Should the open burn spread out of control or off of the burn property, and fire extinguishment becomes necessary, the owner agrees to pay for any resources that may be needed to control and extinguish the fire.
10. The Fire District, Eagle County, and the employees thereof, in issuing a permit, assume no liability or responsibility for any hazardous situation created by the applicant or any damage that may occur as a result of open burning.
11. Open burning may not be allowed under covenants of some developments.
12. The Fire District has the discretion to extinguish a burn at any time for any reason.
